TURQUOISE is the must-have colour right now. Following on the heels of the Olympics, this cool colour is one hot commodity this summer! For an extra burst of soothing, summery appeal, layer turquoise on top of white or powdery grey palettes.

WHITE ON WHITE living areas create a modern and chic aesthetic that is illuminated with energy. Since you're working with a single cool tone, however, the trick is to layer the space with texture and natural materials that will keep spaces looking inviting and warm. Complement the whiteon-white look with a richly coloured area rug, a beautiful oil painting, or a simple

plant to add interest.

**BOLD PATTERNS/LARGE FLORALS** are back in a big way this year, especially florals. They add an instant hit of summer, and can be used indoors on throw pillows or outdoors on patio furniture. Bonus tip: Kill two birds with one stone and look for turquoise florals and patterns on those throw pillows.

GREEN LIVING continues to be very much 'in.' Natural materials and earth tones offer up a timeless look. Sustainable and unusual materials add interest, like mango wood,
